

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Anne Arundel Workforce Development Corporation (AAWDC) will be submitting an application to the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) to receive funding over a period of two years to enhance workforce transit opportunities in northern Anne Arundel County. The key components for this effort will be coordination and enhancement of transit for recipients of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families and other eligible low-income individuals (mobility management), and partnering with the BWI Business Partnership to provide supplemental workforce transportation. AAWDC will focus its efforts on three major employment centers in northern Anne Arundel County: BWI Airport, Arundel Mills, and Fort Smallwood. Our efforts will include outreach to businesses and exploration of establishing vanpools and/or shuttle services from Glen Burnie communities to these employment centers during shift hours. If the application is successful, the funding award may contain Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds through Section 5316 – Job Access and Reverse Commute (JARC) Program.
