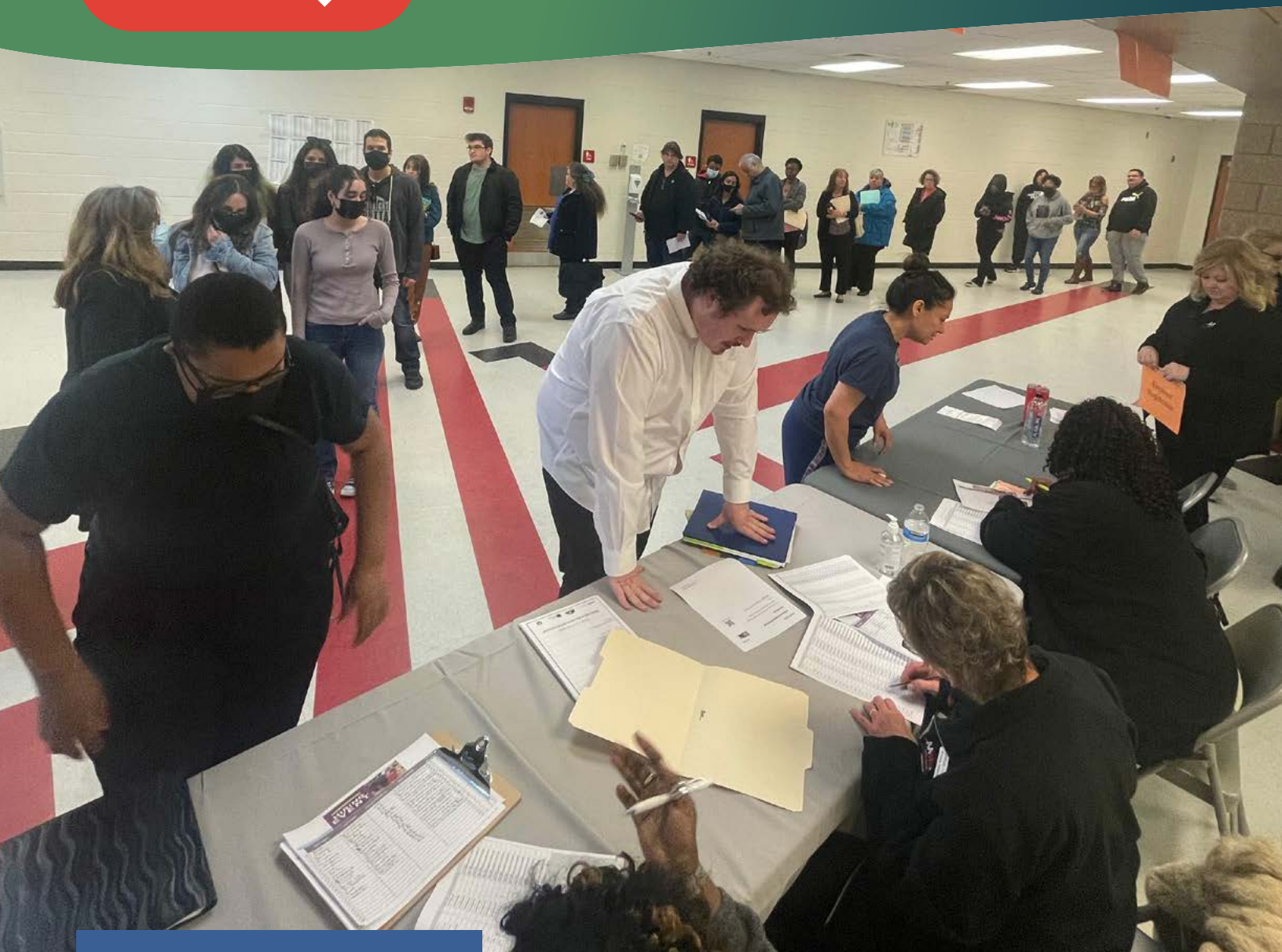

EXCITING COMMUNITY HIRING EVENT



AAWDC partnered with North County High School to host our annual Community Hiring Event in north county. At the event 55 local businesses who were actively hiring for open positions met with 366 job seekers who attended looking for their next career move. The event was an enormous success for everyone in attendance.

SUCCESSFUL CAREER X INTERNSHIP

Seven high school seniors started internships as part of AAWDC's Career X initiative. The internships align to student's career interests and include business, bakery assistant, and real estate. One student Jamarian completed his internship at Weisman Electric and was hired full-time with the company.

HIRING AT BWI AIRPORT



AAWDC partnered with Fraport to hold a BWI Hiring event. Forty-seven businesses attended the event where they met with 63 job seekers from the Baltimore region who were interested in employment at the airport.

BUILDING THE CNA/GNA PIPELINE FOR LOCAL BUSINESSES

The Industry Solutions team continues to work to build a pipeline of skilled talent to meet the needs of the top industries in Anne Arundel County. In Healthcare our Industry team is working with Luminis Healthcare, BrightView Senior Living Communities, Baltimore Washington Medical Center, and FutureCare Health & Management to implement customized CNA/GNA trainings for each of the businesses to meet their needs.

LOCAL HIRING EFFORT IN SEVERN

AAWDC is partnering with Arundel Community Development Services, Inc. (ACDS) to support the local hiring effort for the construction of the Severn Intergenerational Center. The team created an interest form and held several information sessions at the local library and in the community to support residents interested in these employment opportunities.

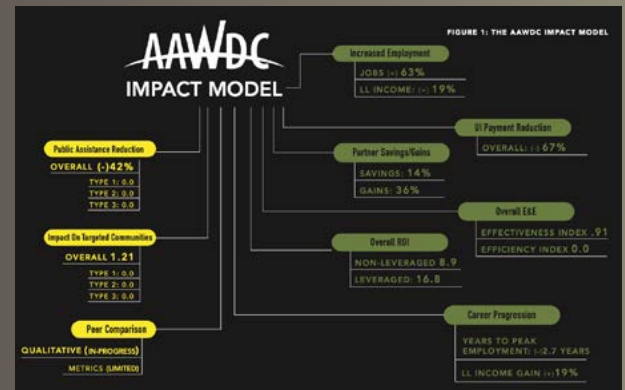


COMMUNITY GARDEN
